



The Federation of New Brunswick Faculty Associations calls for fairness for international students

(Fredericton, December 18, 2024) “On this International Migrants Day, the Federation of New Brunswick Faculty Associations (FNBFA) joins a multitude of New Brunswick organizations in calling for equity for international students,” says FNBFA President Jean Sauvageau.

“Changes to work and study permit caps, restrictions and requirements are having a negative impact on international students in Canada, including in New Brunswick's public post-secondary institutions,” deplores Dr. Sauvageau.

For all the reasons set out in the [statement calling for the immediate repeal of the cuts](#), the FNBFA also calls on the Trudeau government to treat international students with respect and fairness, and to immediately repeal the new caps, restrictions and work and study permit requirements affecting international students in the country.
